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What are Remote Health Pathways (RHP)?

Remote Health Pathways are the use of digital monitoring technology to enable citizens to receive, record and relay relevant information about their current health and wellbeing. It is used to guide self management decisions by the user / patient and to support the health and care team in their treatment and care planning. The pathway doesn't rely on the GP or patient being available at the same time (i.e. Asynchronous) .



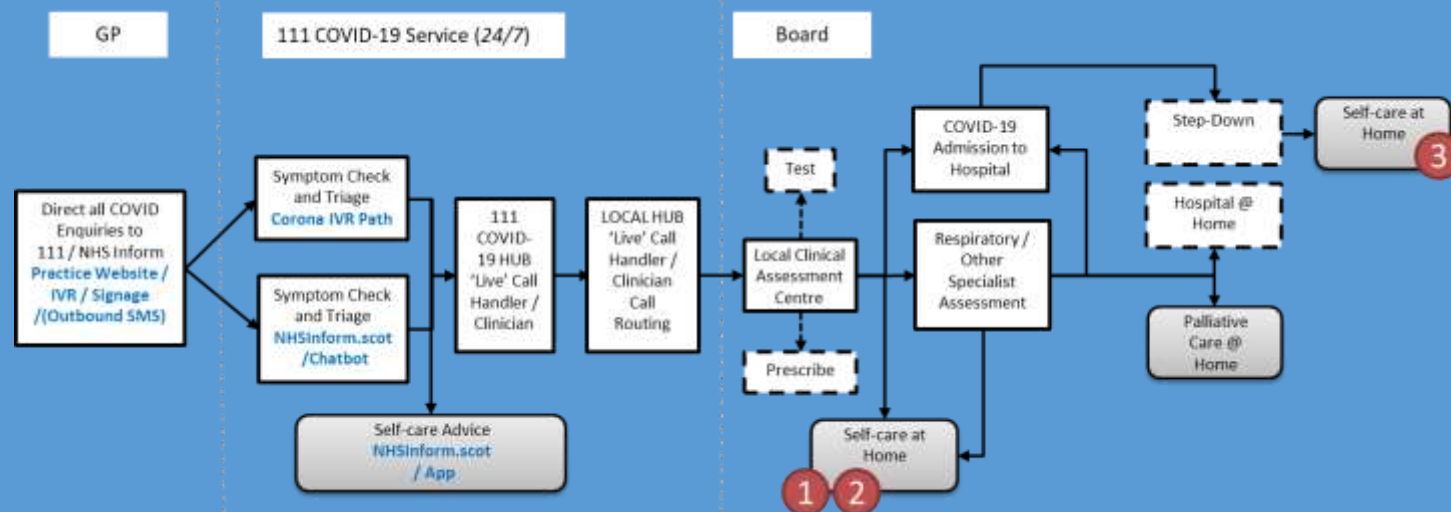

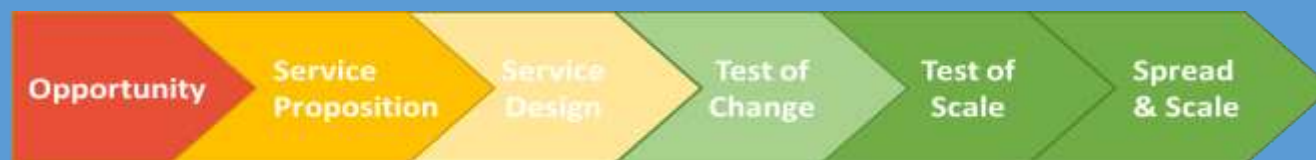
Current Covid Response and Recovery

Public demand for healthcare contacts that are directly related to COVID-19 has grown very quickly. COVID-19 patients who are presenting with poor condition and / or with risk-factors are triaged to local community COVID-19 assessment centres per the pathway below:

There is also a mix of emerging and anticipated demand to support non COVID-19 patients through the Response and Recovery phases. The emergent nature of this demand means it will require responsive, flexible support if it is to be well met. Regardless of the platform the following process allows us to develop and implement services quickly. The process starts with an idea and works through the technical aspects of how technology could make that happen and allows it to be tested quickly before scaling up nationally.



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
